The Intergenerational Schools are an award-winning, nonprofit public charter school model with two campuses in Cleveland, Near West in the Ohio City neighborhood and East in the Buckeye-Woodhill neighborhood.

For 25 years, the schools have offered innovative tuition-free, K-8 education that combines multi-age classrooms, intergenerational community partnerships and whole-child learning to foster bright futures for students and a stronger community for all.

# Our Power, Our Planet: Every Student Makes a Difference

At The Intergenerational School – East, learning about the environment isn't confined to a single unit or science lab. It comes to life through community connection and student leadership.

In April, during Climate and Health Month, the school hosted an Earth Day Fair where Refining Stage (grades 5–6) and Applying Stage (grades 7–8) students created and taught their own interactive lessons to their K-5 peers, families, volunteers, and community partners on topics ranging from renewable energy to conservation and climate justice. Students even made all of their presentations from recycled school materials.

Younger learners were part of the effort too. Students in the Emerging Stage (grades K–2) and Developing Stage (grades 3–4) became “Environmental Protection Agents,” recognizing classmates for everyday choices that protect the planet, such as refilling water bottles and recycling.

The fair reflected the school's guiding philosophy that real learning, and real change, happen when generations and communities learn together. “The Earth Day event is another great example of the cross-disciplinary, student-led and

community-focused approach that makes our schools so special,” said Brooke King, CEO. “It combined science, social studies and citizenship, and gave everyone who attended the chance to both teach and learn.”

That commitment to shared learning extended beyond the school walls. Refining Stage student Antonio Pace was one of the students who presented his research at Case Western Reserve University's Undergraduate Society for Bioethics and Health Humanities for a dialogue on climate and health. Antonio's project focused on the Great Global Cleanup.

Each project, conversation, and connection brought the same lesson to life: when students of all ages learn with purpose, they build a healthier world for generations to come.

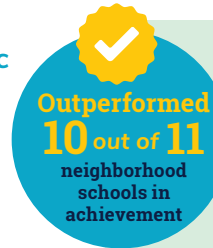

# Brewing Confidence and Collaboration: Lessons from the Near West Tea Shop

Now in its fifth year, the student-run Tea Shop at Near West Intergenerational School continues to brew more than tea. What began as a small indoor recess idea in Beth McAllister's Developing Stage classroom (grades 3-4 in typical schools) has become a hallmark example of how Near West empowers teachers and students alike to be creative and learn through real life experience.

Each week, students manage every aspect of the Tea Shop, from interviewing applicants and designing schedules to marketing, ordering supplies, preparing orders and delivering tea to staff. The shop's success lies not in perfection but in purpose. And every step of the way, students develop confidence, practice collaboration, and apply classroom lessons.

"My essential question was, 'Why are communication and collaboration essential for organizations to run effectively'?" said Mrs. McAllister. "When children take on meaningful

work together, they see how their words and actions shape the community they're part of."

That philosophy became the foundation for Mrs. McAllister's master's-level course project in spring 2025, part of the Curriculum and Methods class offered through the schools' partnership with The National Teachers College. She later shared her approach with colleagues, illustrating how student-driven enterprises can teach standards-aligned lessons in literacy, math, and social-emotional learning while cultivating a sense of responsibility and joy.

Near West inspires mastery, belonging, and a lifelong love of learning for every student.

The students created an Owner's Manual to pass down knowledge to future tea shopkeepers. Their guidance captures those lessons in their own words, advising their peers on leadership, creativity, and teamwork. As one student wrote, "We hope this handbook helps others make their classrooms and the world a better place."

For Mrs. McAllister and her students, that spirit of shared ownership and lifelong learning is the secret ingredient that has transformed one teacher's idea into a cherished community tradition.

# Academic Performance

We offer high-quality, tuition free public education for students K-8. Our students learn in inclusive, multi-age classrooms that support mastery, that support mastery and joyful learning, not test-prep pressure.

- **For the 2024-2025 academic year**, both campuses were designated an **Ohio Community School of Quality**.
- **Intergenerational Schools students consistently outperform nearby non-selective\* schools** in Cleveland. For the 2024–2025 Ohio School Report Cards:
- **Near West earned 4.5 stars overall** for the second year in a row, ranking #3 overall of 107 K-8 public schools in Cleveland on the achievement measure.\*\*
- **TIS–East outperformed 10 of 11 neighborhood schools\*\*\*** in key indicators like Achievement, Early Literacy, and Gap Closing (up two full stars from last year), and reduced chronic absenteeism by more than 3x the state target.
